Studies show that rapid increase in population growth creates problems for developing countries. So why don't people have fewer children? The information collected from developed countries suggests that it is only when people's living standards begin to rise, birth rates begin to fall. There are good reasons for this. Poor countries cannot afford social services and old age pensions _ the money they get from the government when they become old and can't work _ and people's incomes are so low that they have nothing to save for their future. As a result, people look to their children to provide them with financial help in their old age. Having a large family can be a form of insurance. And even while they are still quite young, children can do a lot of useful jobs on a small farm. So poor people in a developing country need to see clear signs of much better conditions ahead before they can think of having smaller families. But their conditions cannot be improved unless there is a decrease in the rate at which population is increasing. This will depend on a very much wider acceptance of family planning and this, in turn, will mean basic changes in people's ideas.
